Oil spill at duck race in downtown Bend

The Bend Fire Department responded Sunday afternoon to an oil spill on the Galveston Bridge, when the crane that was being used in the Great Drake Park Duck Race leaked hydraulic fluid.

The department estimated between 25 and 30 gallons of oil leaked from the crane, which could not be used for the duck race. According to a news release, the fire department absorbed most of the oil within 90 minutes of arriving on the scene, although some of the oil seeped into the Deschutes River.

Brush fire ignites in southeast Bend

A brush fire broke out Saturday evening in southeast Bend in an open field near homes.

According to a news release, the fire at 61855 Pettigrew Road was pushed by light winds toward homes and taller bushes, but a crew from the Bend Fire Department was able to quickly put the fire out.

The cause of the blaze has not been determined, but officials noted the fire was near the road, which was littered with cigarette butts.

Fire officials remind Bend residents that although the weather is cooling, grass and other fuels are still very dry and easily ignited.
